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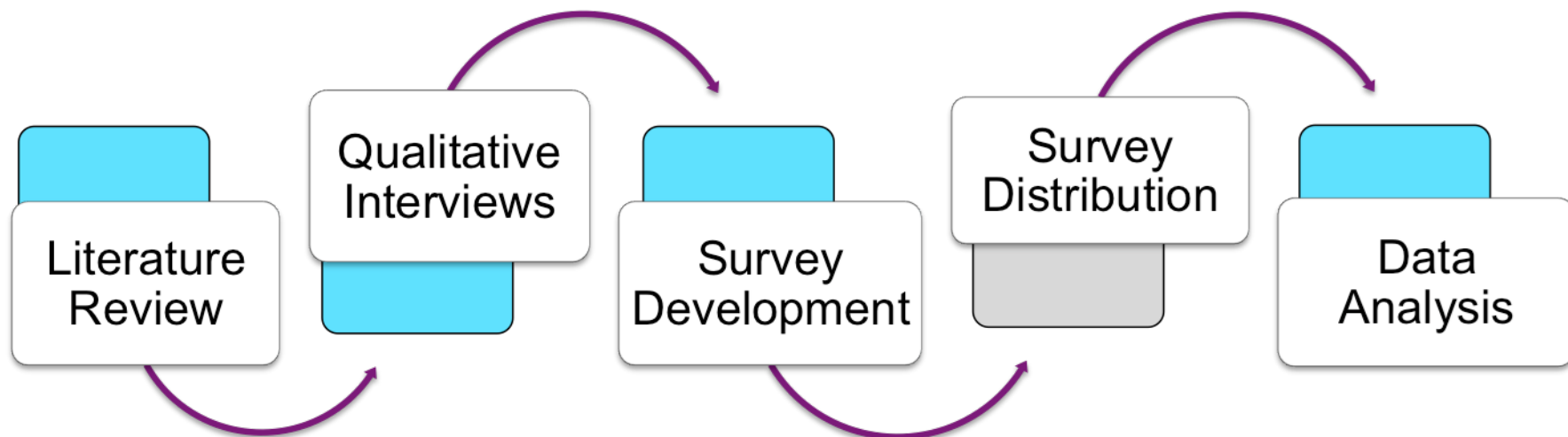

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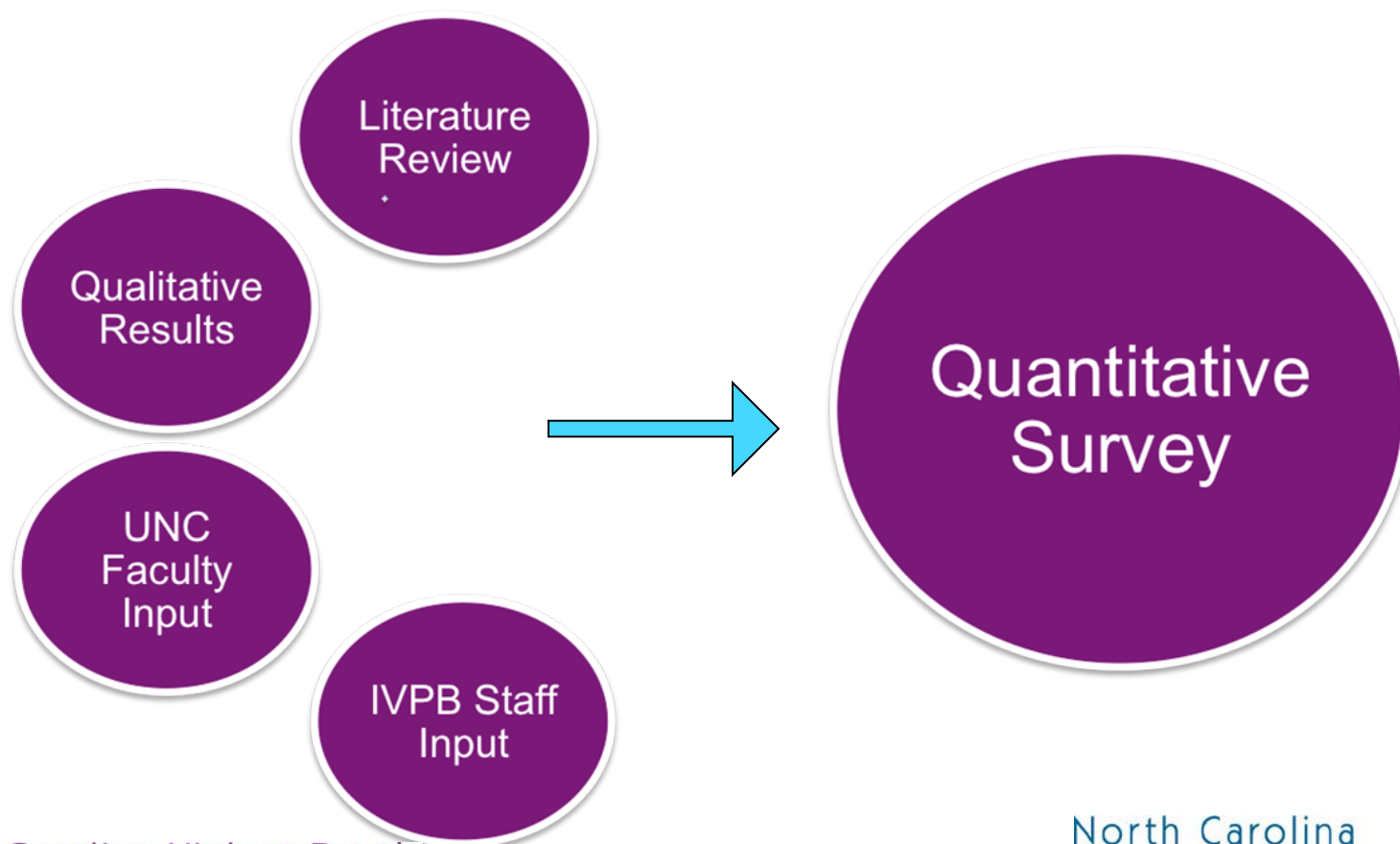

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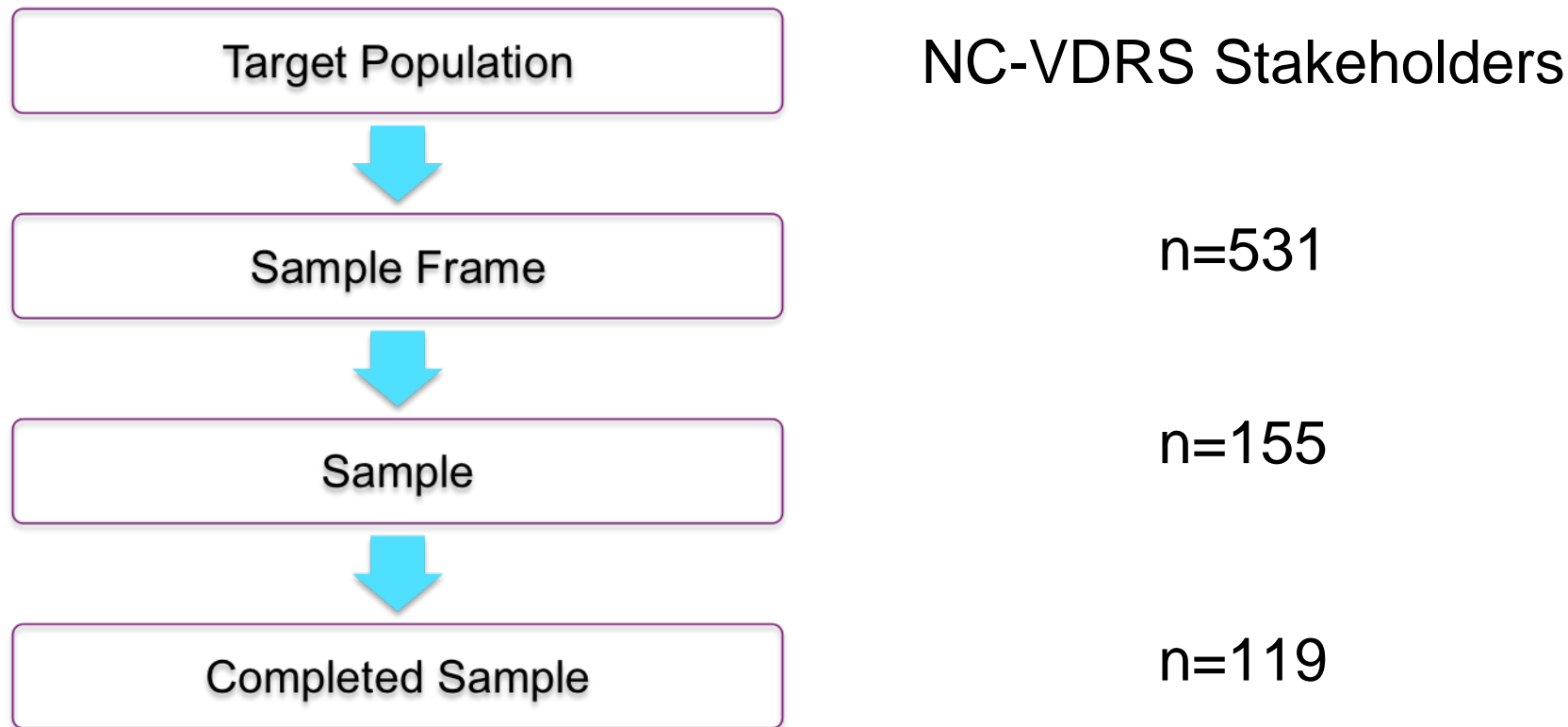


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Quantitative Survey Distribution



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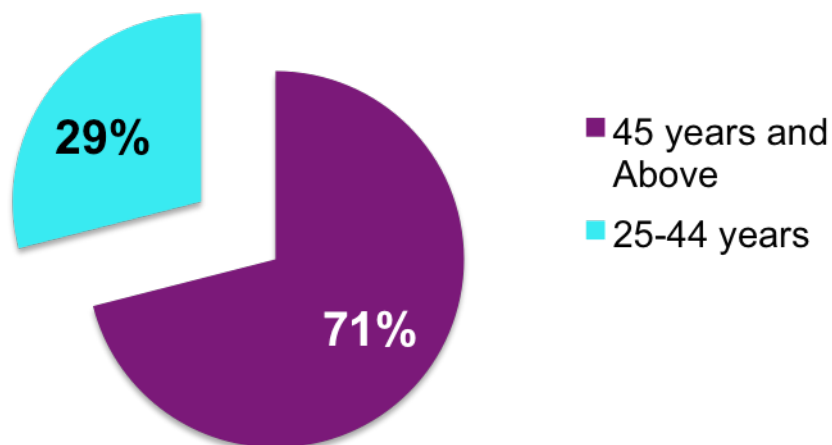
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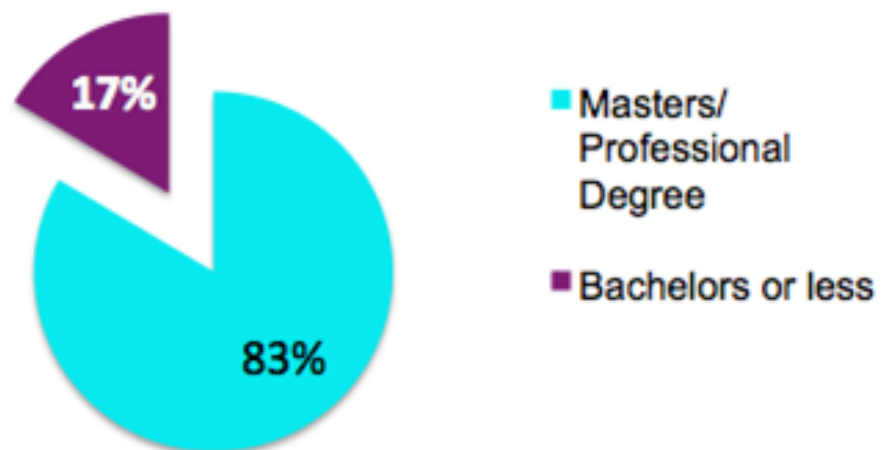


Quantitative Survey Respondent Demographics

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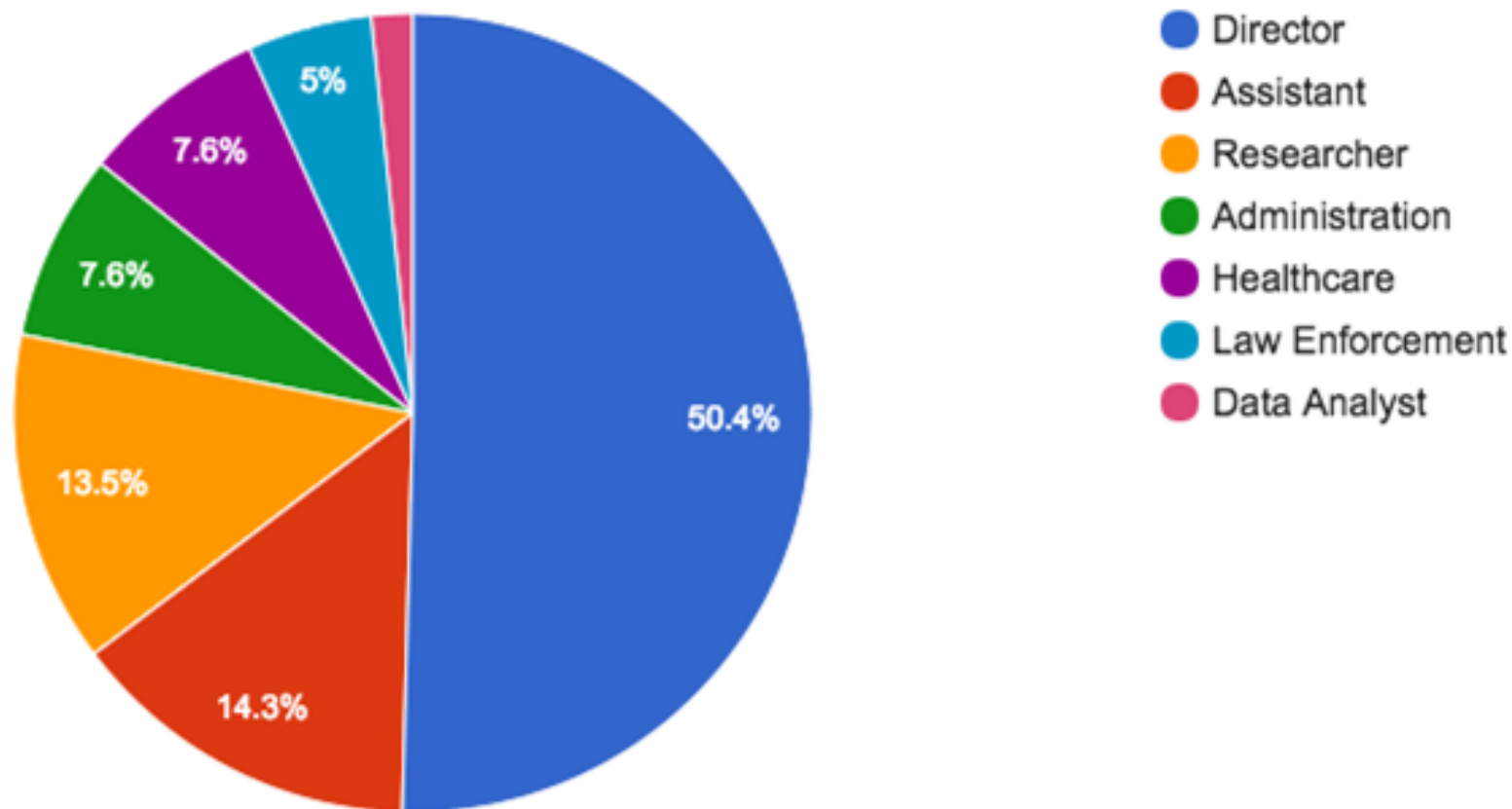
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Current Job Title of Respondents



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Qualitative Interview Responses

For a community... not to have comprehensive data on injury and death due to behaviors that are occurring within that community—which means they are preventable—is immoral. We see [VDRS] as being extremely **moral** and **ethical** and **needed** and **necessary** and **compassionate** and [a] **rational** response to a community that is losing...that is having lives taken from it...at a rate of about every other week... for decades. What is so frustrating for us, and what I think we grieve the most...is that **these are preventable deaths**.

The VDRS provides us with numbers, real hard data that can **help us understand** who's dying...how are they dying... where are the points **where we can intervene.**

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Qualitative Interview Results

Informants consistently emphasized the usefulness and potential applications of infographics

Improving data dissemination by holding in-person meetings and events

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Qualitative Interview Results

Reasons for using NC-VDRS data varied greatly: The majority of informants utilized the reports NCDPH generated

Emphasis on engaging community-based organizations in data use projects

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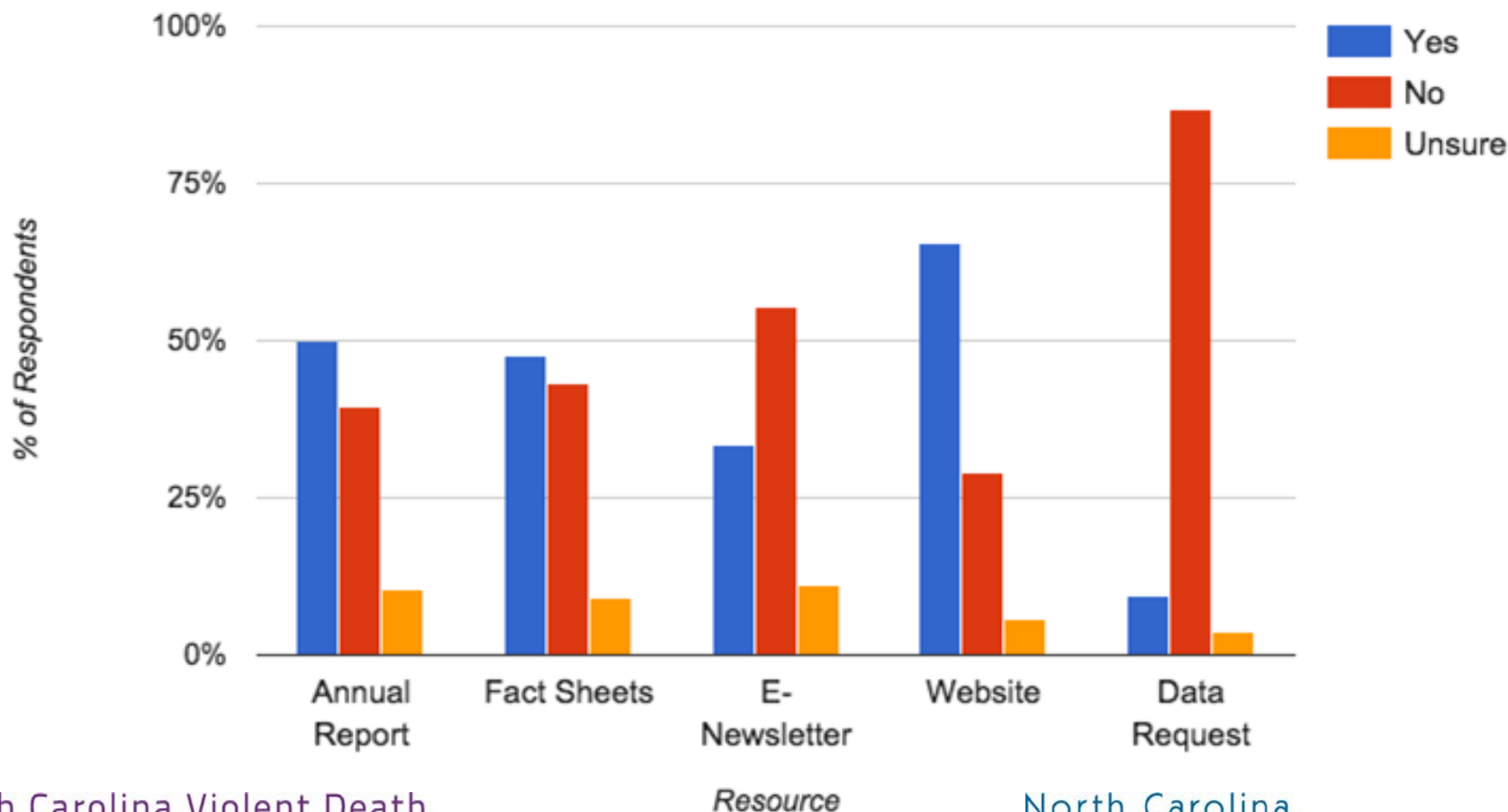
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Respondents Self-Reported Previous Use of Resource

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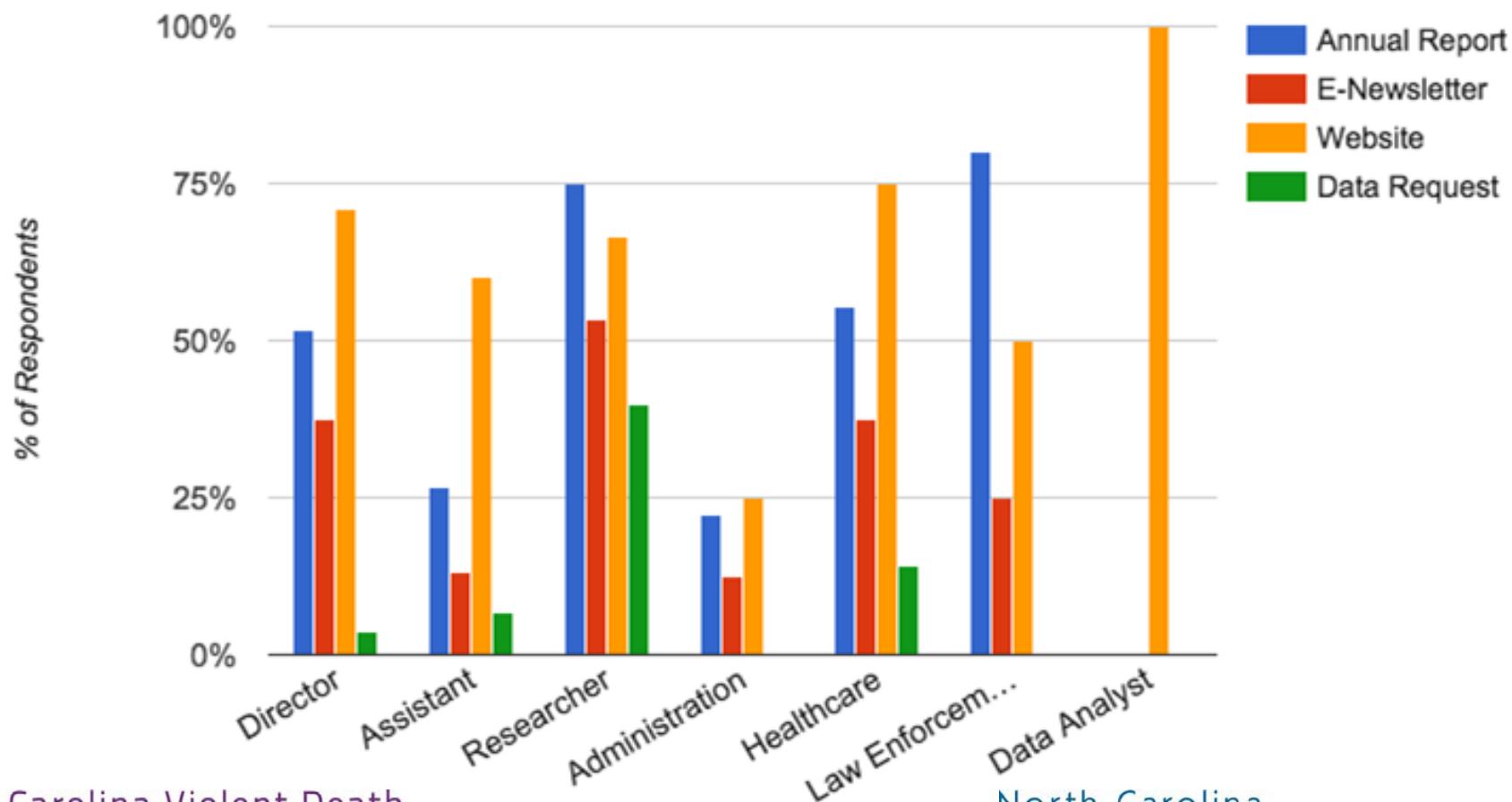
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Self-Reported Use of NC-VDRS Resource by Job Title

3. Over 90% of NC-VDRS users reported ease of use

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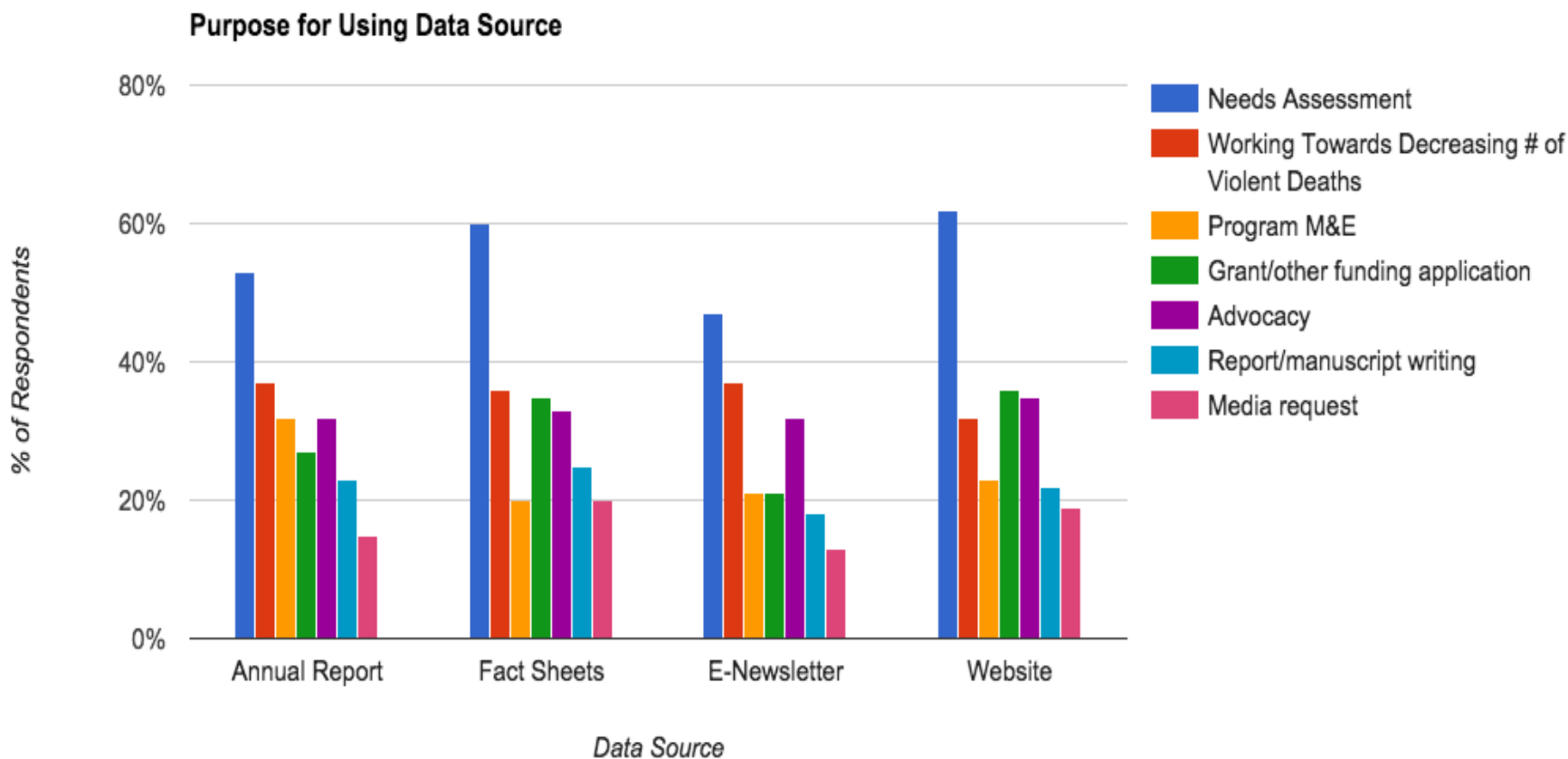


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4. Needs assessments were the most common use of NC-VDRS data

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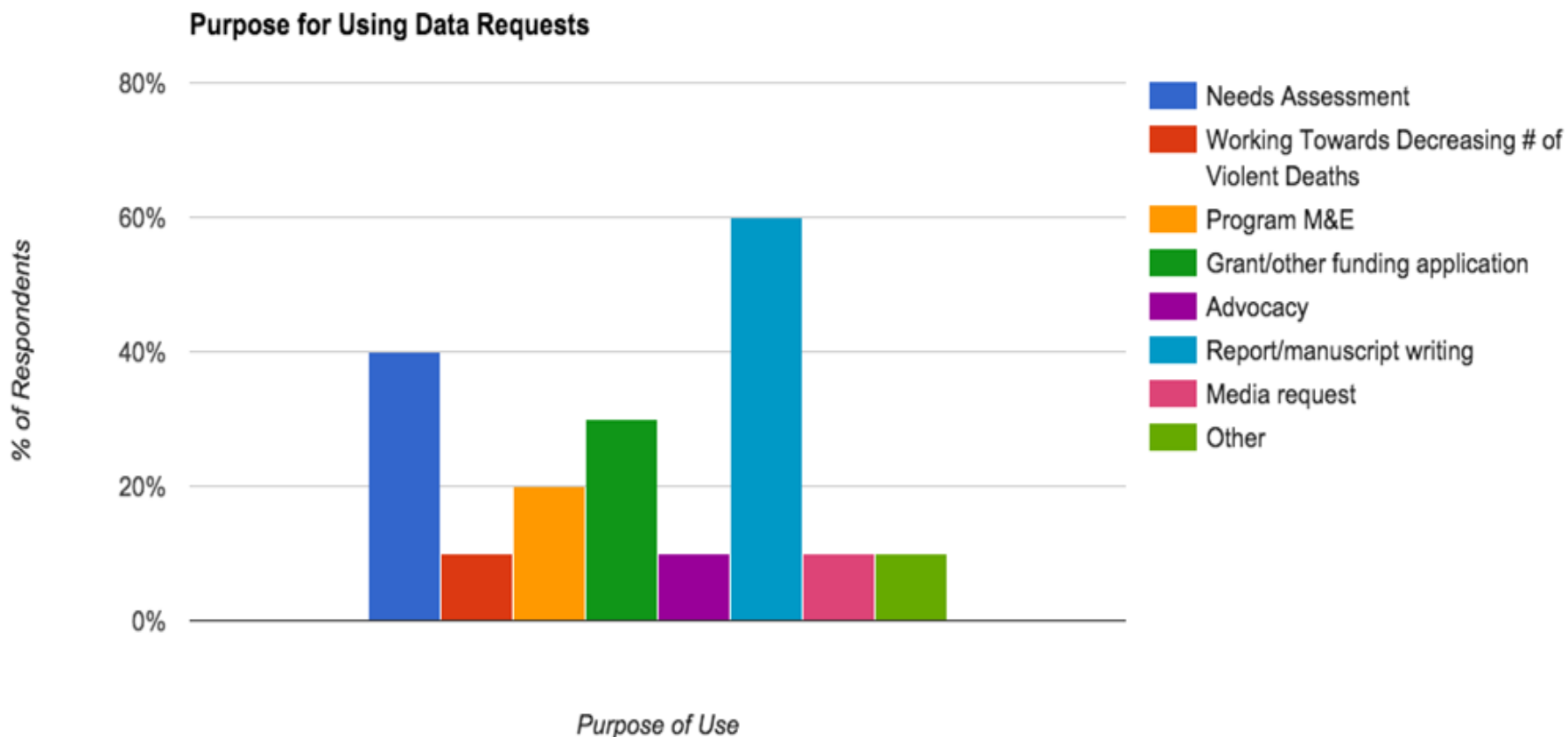


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4. Needs assessments were the most common use of NC-VDRS data
5. Report writing was the most common reason for making a data request

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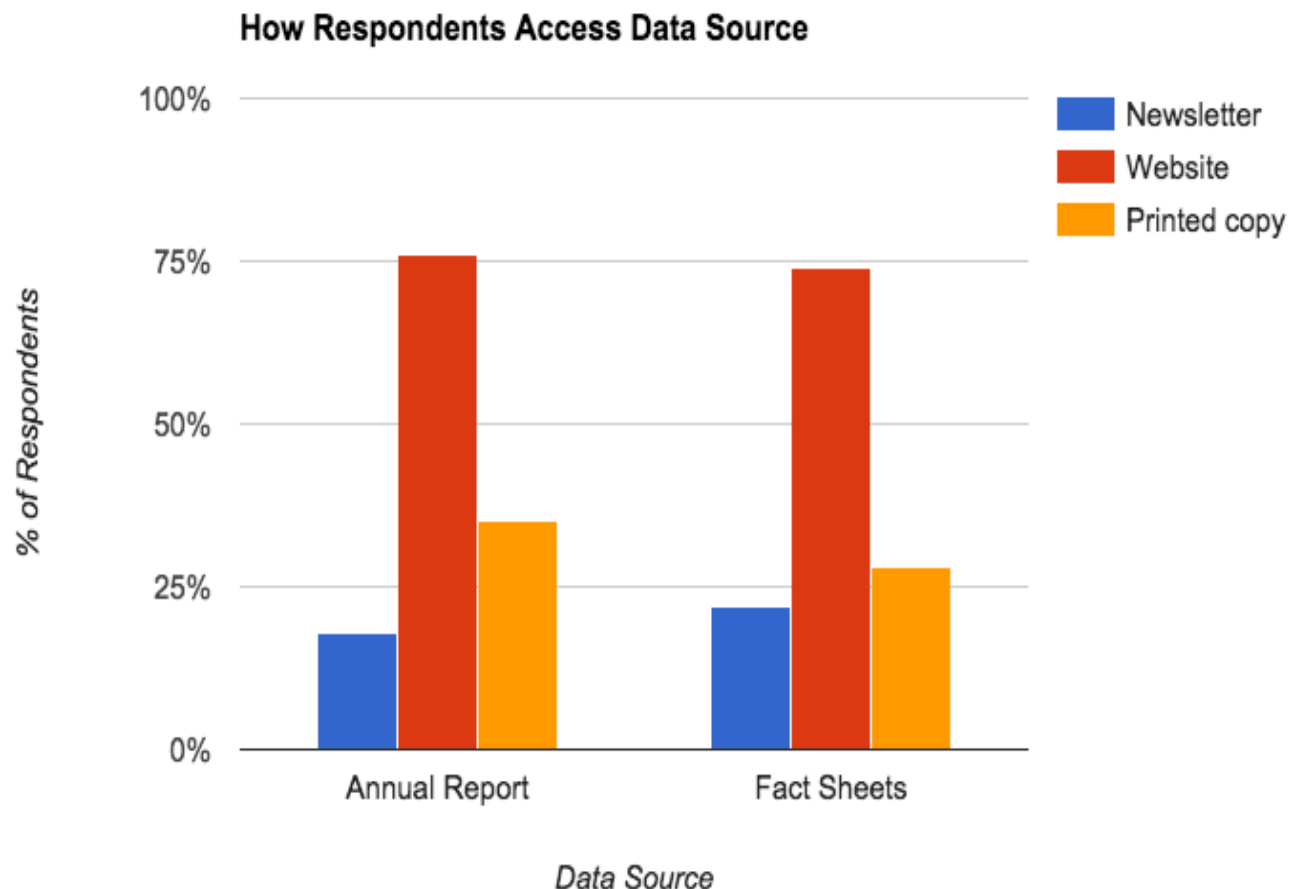


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Overall, the website is the most powerful tool for accessing data

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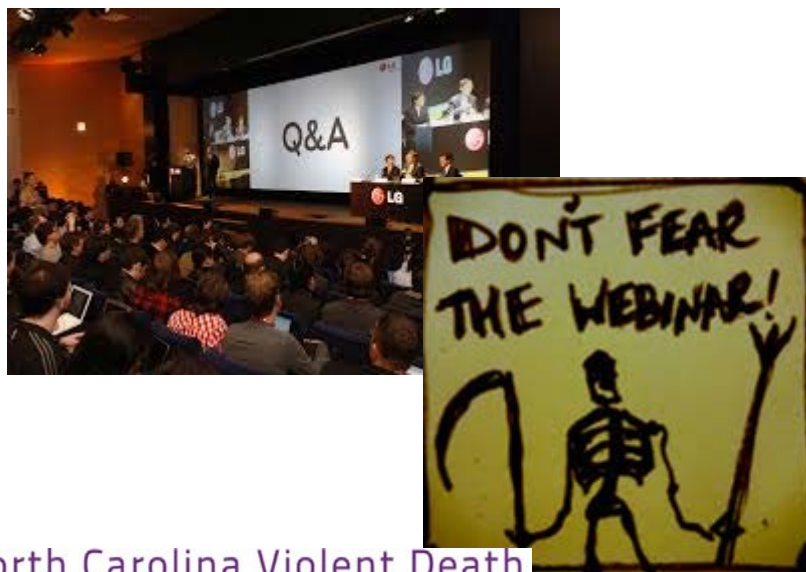
Violent Death Data

Violence, whether from assault or self-inflicted, takes the lives of nearly five North Carolinians every day (2006). Surveillance data can improve understanding of the causes and circumstances of violent deaths. Along with data from vital records, hospital discharge and emergency department data, in N.C. there is a system called [The North Carolina Violent Death Reporting System \(N.C. VDRS\)](#) that provides detailed information on deaths that result from violence.
