







 Times of change and uncertainty call for leadership.

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

Public health leaders should embrace the role of Chief Health Strategist for their communities—working with all relevant partners so that they can drive initiatives including those that explicitly address "upstream" social determinants of health. Specialized Public Health 3.0 training should be available for those preparing to enter or already within the public health workforce.

- Inside-out leaders create future focused, collaborative and visionary strategies for their organizations
- Sustainability strategy = cross-sector work showing
 value to stakeholders beyond your own health agency
- Adaptive strategy = reframe the work of public health to focus on population health
 - Show return on investment, value
 - Link to business, growth, job creation (non-governmental)
 - Beware of the "pocket problem"

Total US DHHS Outlays in 2017 = \$ 1.14 trillion




Total CDC Budget = \$ 7.146 billion

Focus on preventive health care

As reported in the Dec. 8 front-page article "Expected life span declines in America," the health of our nation is in trouble: Children who live in the United States may live shorter and less healthy lives than their parent's generation. There are many reasons for this decline. First and foremost, we continue to focus on health-care service delivery and medical intervention after people get sick, and we fail to invest in prevention efforts that keep us healthy in the first place.

The time is now to reorient the work of the U.S. health-care system toward prevention and to invest in these efforts at the local, state and national levels. If we truly want a health-care system versus a "sick-care" system, we have to focus on the things that keep us healthy. That is the job of public health, and we need it now more than ever.

Few are talking about another extremely important part of the ACA, the Prevention and Public Health Fund, which provides major investments in prevention and public health programs that significantly contribute to better health outcomes and reduce healthcare costs.

The Prevention and Public Health Fund, established by the ACA, was designed as a resource for disease prevention and health promotion efforts. Its goal is to support public health programs that prevent illness and disease. Most deaths (nearly 70%) are caused by chronic diseases, such as cancer, stroke, heart





Stories of Impact – One State's Examples

- "The Department would lose its ability to continue immunization infrastructure work until the end of the project period. A loss of funding would potential results in staff layoffs and discontinuation of work with health care providers..."
- "...A reduction or elimination of the PPHF would greatly impact, or shut down, the QuitLine and SmartApp, which provides telephone-based counseling and web0based resources to help tobacco users quit..."
- "Outbreak investigation and reporting on tick surveillance and daily lab support for routine diagnostic and surveillance testing activities would be eliminated..."

Dear Leader McConnell, Minority Leader Schumer, Speaker Ryan, and Democratic Leader Pelosi:

As nonpartisan, consensus-driven national organizations representing state, territorial, and local governmental public health leaders we respectfully request your continued support for vital public health programs currently funded through the Affordable Care Act's (ACA) Prevention and Public Health Fund. State, territorial, and local health leaders are concerned that long-standing public health programs now receiving resources through the Fund authorized by the ACA may be rescinded in repeal and replace efforts if we do not quickly identify alternative ways to invest in prevention and the support the life-saving work of state and territorial health agencies. We ask that you delay any efforts to rescind Prevention and Public Health Fund dollars to ensure that state and local public health is not crippled in the middle of fiscal year 2017.


